

FIS Secondary School Pathways

The table below outlines pathways to post-secondary education, with possible recognition options within Germany. The minimum possible exit qualification recognised in Germany is an MYP Certificate with 32 points and above. Students who do not meet any of the requirements below will be issued a Certificate of Attendance ("Schulbesuchsbescheinigung", confirming their years of enrollment and academic achievements in their final year of study.

Repeating a Grade Level: A student may opt to repeat a maximum of two grade levels during their time at the FIS in order to meet with success in one of the above pathways. If a student chooses to repeat grades 11 or 12, the school recommends that they repeat grade 11 (repeating grade 12 may negatively impact recognition of the IB Diploma in Germany).
